"TOP 10 LIST"

WHAT EVERY ALLERGY INJECTION PATIENT SHOULD KNOW

1. Please tell the allergy shot giver, if you are more than 10 days late for your next injection.
2. Please tell the allergy shot giver, if you are experiencing any allergy symptoms today, before your allergy injection.
3. Please tell the allergy shot giver, if you are ill today, or have been ill since last injection.
4. Please tell the allergy shot giver, if you have experienced, a delayed reaction, from the previous allergy injection.
5. Please tell the allergy shot giver, if you are unable to wait (the mandatory) 30 minutes, after your injections, before you receive your injection.
6. Please tell the allergy shot giver, when you would like, your next allergy injection "appt." before you leave the injection room.
7. Please notify the allergy shot giver immediately, if you experience any allergy symptoms /reactions immediately following your injection.
8. Please continue to use your asthma & allergy medications, as directed by your physician.
9. Please remember...that all asthmatics, are expected to perform a peak flow before every allergy injection.
10. Please remember, the asthma/allergy staff would like your visit to be as enjoyable and safe as possible.
